New CEO Speaks:

Kendra Davenport the new CEO of easterseals recently had a town hall format via Zoom where she outlined some of her ambitious goals for the future. There are over 61 million people with disabilities in the U.S. meaning one in four are living with a disability. This is 10% of the workforce. Kendra referenced that easterseals needs to meet the needs of people within our communities better. There is a need to focus on marketing, expanding their donor base, cutting direct mailings by 1/3, offering crypto currency and a strategy to guide and direct fundraising advocacy. She also wants to see an expansion of their mental health support programs, along with more help and respect to caregivers. Most of all Kendra wants to give hope that all disabilities have limitless possibilities.

Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

This year, July 26 marks the 32nd anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act. Easterseals was a leading advocate and actively lobbied to ensure its passage into law. With ESA's ongoing support for Easterseals, we will continue to make progress for a more equitable, accessible, and inclusive future for all.


including the new variant, are on the rise once again.


We are happy and sad that Judy Harris will be permanently moving to Florida in December. She has bought a home very close to where her daughter will also be making the move from Cincinnati.




