



Easter seals OSC report 9/2019

"They don't want to die, they just want to get rid of the pain." These were the words of parents whose child, they stated was the 22nd veteran that day to commit suicide. GiveVets22.org is a social movement to raise awareness of veteran suicide. Suicide is a crisis in communities across America. In Ohio and Kentucky the veteran suicide rate is nearly double. Using just the national average of 22 per day times 365 equals 8,030. Remember Ohio and Kentucky can double that amount.

One phone call to Easterseals military and veteran services eliminates red tape and opens closed doors to get America's returning heroes the support they need to transition to civilian life. The needs of our veterans and military families is evolving, not disappearing. Easterseals specializes in identifying their needs, particularly with employment, job training, education and support like family respite opportunities plus health and wellness programs

In Greater Cincinnati last year there were 2,000+ emergency support calls answered 750+ veterans placed in jobs 100+ veterans placed in education 300% increase in demands for services
